The 1906 Electoral Roll has them, at "Hopkins River".

Mrs. ARMYTAGE, Constance's mother died in 1909, by which time Constance was in England, and the short marriage was over. There were apparently no children.

Does anyone have any information about the FITZPATRICK's while they lived at "Hopkins River" between 1906 and 1909?

Taliesin WILLIAMS of Morgrugryn Farm, Woodford, to Frances CARTER, younger daughter of William CARTER, late of Geelong [26]. See also *The Warrnambool Standard* of 25 June, 1875.

ITEMS OF INTEREST

J E L TUCKER long-time Revenue Officer in Warrnambool, promoted to Receiver and Paymaster at Horsham - universal favourite - promotion overdue [2].

Const HEAVER appointed inspector of dogs, goats, cattle, etc. [2].

H OSBURNE, Examiner Office, authorises George B LILLY to collect his accounts and subscriptions due [2].

Henry MAWBAY purchases Soap and Candle Factory from ISLES and GRIFFEN and Fellmongery on the Merri - big advert [9].

David POLLOCK applies for license to slaughter at his Merri Creek yards - granted [16]. Sued [30].

George LANCE advertises for sale very handsome kerosene chandeliers, suitable for public buildings [16].

Dr GIBTON gives a lecture at Christ Church re "The Influence of Mind upon Matter" - text recorded [19].

Stone building being erected for W KUCKS, baker, adjoining premises now occupied by Mr BREBNER in Liebig Street. Contractor - John GAUL. Details given briefly [23].

Office bearers of newly-formed Rifle Club. Pres - Capt C A CRAMER; Vice-Pres' - Capt A DAVIES; Hon Treas - H C MACDONALD; Hon Sec - E L C WHEELER; Committee - D O'MULLANE, J CHADWICK, J F ARER F L WEISS, S WATSON, J TYLER and A HORTLE [23].

Charles EVERETT advertises lease of America Bowling Saloon for sale; also the shop in front with billiard room [26].

William COUTTS, long and favourably known as barman at the Commercial Hotel, has taken the Penshurst Hotel, lately

occupied by J B MORRIS. COUTTS is also about to marry a competent young lady [26].

Dr BRADFORD has left the district - his household furniture, etc., advertised for sale [30].

The *Examiner* acknowledges receipt of new toilet soap manufactured from blue gum by Henry WATTS, well-known perfumer, at one time numbered amongst our townsmen [30].

W H GRIMBL Y of the Western Hotel, disposes of his business to H COE, long and favourably known as proprietor of the Commercial Hotel in Belfast - Mr GRIMBL Y returning to his old quarters at Brighton, where he has long resided [30].

To be Let: Central business premises, Liebig Street, occupied by Thomas FIDLER - premises described (shops, apartments and cellars) - other details [16J].

Francis M'ALOON, Licensed Victualler, insolvent - causes and debts given [19].

Very detailed description of the new Presbyterian Church - marble tablet to late Rev James DALRYMPLE has been removed from the old church and fixed near the pulpit at east end of church [26].

George Chas FRICKER Sheriff's Officer, Belfast, gives notice that all stock in trade, furniture, etc., at the Criterion Hotel, Kepler Street, licensee Michael F COSTELLOE, is to be sold. Case of NINNIS V COSTELLOE [26].

Sale of Crown Lands at Custom House - 12 town allotments auctioned by J H CRAIG - F H BRUFORD acting in place of A W MUSGROVE, Collector of Customs [2].

W C BYASS designs banner for Warrnambool Branch of the Protestant Alliance Friendly Society - very elaborate - details given - to be ordered from Belfast for between £40 and £50 [9].

William FOOTE, manager of Liebig Street weighbridge, advertises he is a cash purchaser of potatoes and butter [9].

John MAHONEY offers for sale his well-known property, 'Silver Hill' - 22 plus acres near Russell's Creek - details given [9].

Robert NEWTON, borough rate-collector - referred to in police court [12].

Board of Advice queries non-attendance of children at school - details re James TINKER, Alicia LOCK, George BAYNES, Ellis BONHAM, James ##### MARR #####, NEWLAN (small girl) - some cases of genuine hardship revealed [30].

Applications for licenses under the Land Act approved -
For Laang: John BUCK, G NEEAVE, John FLYNN, Carl SCHERBER
For Tallangatta: W DRAKE.
For rural store license at Purnim: J McGRATH [30].

The Examiner, June 1875, continued

A GREED, long proprietor of blacksmith and wheelwright business at Crossley, leaving for Hamilton - *Examiner* contradicts statement that J CUMMINS of Crossley had purchased GREED's business [30].

2 allotments (at Framlingham and Panmure) owned by William WALL the younger, to be sold by the sheriff [16].

Sarah WILD sues Henry PHILLIPS for rent - reference to Minerva WILD - defendant absent in Queensland [5].

James CHARD sues James BRYDEN for illicitly impounding cattle in 1872. Witness - Thomas CHARD (son). References to COTTERELL, CLARKE and BAXTER - employees of BRYDEN [5J].

Thomas DIXON advertises his milk and denies charge re its quality [5J].

Billy YOUL, well-known Aboriginal, brought to town by police at Belfast - found in scrub near Rosebrook in miserable state - given 2 months in gaol on vagrancy charge which will afford him food and clothing over winter [19].

Job WINES and James WINES summoned on information of James STEEL, new manager of Warrnambool Woollen Mill Co, because of strongly worded letter received by latter objecting to suggestions that the mill be relocated from Woodford to Warrnambool- a question of great concern at the time [26].

J W CHILD to move his boot factory to premises now being erected next door but one to Bromfield's Medical Hall in Liebig Street - description of stock [25].

Article "Warrnambool and Its Sports" by "A Visitor" copied from the *Leader* [25].

Paterson & Co, importers, advertise fabrics just arrived from London ex *TYROL* and *NEWCASTLE* - also iron-mongery, portmanteaux and rum [25].

Big advert for R W H BROWNE [25].

Mrs SPENCER advertises tuition for young ladies in English, French, Music and Drawing. She acquired the French language during a long residence in Paris and its neighbourhood. References from clergymen and parents of former pupils. Two items [29].

Thomas BOWMAN to lecture on "Restored Sunbeams", with experiments and vocal and instrumental music. To aid church building fund [1 & 4]. See also *Examiner* of 5 June 1875. W F PLEYDELL and J LORD assist BOWMAN in his experiments. Items by Mrs HEATHCOTE and F VINEY [8].

Long discussion re moving Woollen Mill - remarks by Messrs STRUTH and WINES and BLIGH (humorous), L PARKINSON and D WILLIAMS [4]. More re WINES letter on 29 June - 2 items. Reference to William WEBB, a tenant of Job WINES at Woodford [29].

EDINA sold for Sydney and Northern trade [4].

Shire Council - P MILLER and G GOOMING agree to pay expense of a drain at Nirranda [4]; R ALWOOD seeks permission to make a corduroy bridge over a boggy place at Nirranda for £6 [4].

More re Alfred GUINN selling ale on unlicensed premises - fined and told to close establishment [4].

Insolvencies: William BRADLEY, J A Wallace DUNLOP of Connewarren, Robert JONES and John FLAXMAN of Warrnambool. Lots of detail re case of Joseph OGLE [8].

More re William THORPE ("Possum Bill") and James BOLGER [8].

Praise for Const HEAVER by a ratepayer [11].

More re court case between Messrs WEISS and GRIMBL Y re chastisement of child [22 & 25]. See also *Examiner* - 19 June 1875.

DEATHS

Edward Henry WILSON (4 months) and Robert Wallace WILSON (16 months) - sons of R J WILSON, Fairy Street [1].

Margaret BOYD - at the home of her brother, Col MARTIN - at Formby, Stanfield, England. Fortified with all the Sacraments of the Church [29].

McKENZIE children. Father - Duncan McKENZIE of Purnim. Sudden and tragic deaths from diphtheria. Sad tale told. Help given by Mrs PEARCE of Princess Alexandra Hotel [1]. See also *Examiner* of 2 June 1875.

Dorothy La Trobe Foster

In the High School Register for this month, pupil No. 1043 is Dorothy Foster, daughter of W A L F Foster, Clerk of Courts. As Dorothy La Trobe Leopold, she wrote two books.

The first, *With A Letter to Mr La Trobe*, was published in 1988, and tells some of the story of Governor La Trobe.

The second, *Catty and the Magistrate*, was published posthumously in 1998, largely due to the efforts of her sister Margaret, Mrs Sharp.

Quoting from this latter book,
Dorothy La Trobe Leopold always had an interest in writing. She was a member of various writing groups such as the Women Writers' Guild and her encouraging other writers came from her deep Christian commitment. Her personal career included working as a governess in New Guinea; an officer in the Permanent Air Force during World War II; and a speech therapist. She also had a great love of history.

Catty and the Magistrate is a fascinating tale of a pioneering family and its many members. Catty, born Catherine MacLean Paterson in New South Wales in 1836, was to become Dorothy Foster's paternal grandmother. She married W H Foster, a magistrate who served both in the Western District and in Gippsland. Catty died in Ballarat in 1895.

Many Western District families and properties come up in the narrative, which, while largely based on diaries of her grandfather and others, allows some literary licence to fill the gaps. 'Borhoneygurk' at Morrisons on the Moorabool River receives special attention.

William Adolphus La Trobe, third child of Catty and the Magistrate, married Olive May McDowall in 1910. There were four children, including Dorothy. W A L F Foster died in Warrnambool on 15 September, 1943.

A recommended read for anyone interested in the early history of our State, and in the difficulties of life in the 19th Century, even for those well placed in society.
