J F BELCHER, many years collector of customs and keeper of the powder magazine, relieved of his duties under the Commonwealth - Sgt MOONEY appointed in his place [16].

Long description of C J M'CALLUM's Fibre and Oil industry - in building that was once PATTERSON's, idle for many years [16].

E BATTARBEE's iron frieze and shop veranda tom away when runaway horse in Chinese vegetable cart bolted [17].

Dean SLATTERY presents the nuns of St Ann's convent with a waggonette built expressly to his orders by STEPHEN Bros, Koroit Street - carries 7 persons [7].
