

1992 GRD AVAILABLE

The 1992 edition of Genealogical Research Directory is currently being distributed to subscribers. This years edition is of a similar format and layout to previous years and once again contains some 100,000 odd surnames being researched here in Australia and around the world.

This years edition contains the usual lists of Major Research Repositories, One Name Societies and Genealogical Societies with accompanying maps and abbreviations. Researching in Italy is the topic of this years feature article.

An interesting recommendation in this years edition is that IRC's not be used when writing internationally due to the excessive profits of postal authorities.

The recently introduced subject entry is greatly expanded this year and is becoming a worthwhile feature of the directory.

For the computer using family historian there is a list of computer Bulletin Boards both here in Australia and overseas.

As always the directory is highly recommended to all family historians.

IRISH CONNECTION

In earlier editions of Irish Connection I gave some lists of names of the various groups of emmigrants who settled in Ireland, recently I was looking through 'Irish Pedigrees' by John O'Hart. In volume 2 of this publication there are numerous lists of names that could be of interest to the researcher of things Irish.

The first list compiled by Dr Philip MacDermot, is of 'Families In Ireland From The 11th To The End Of The 16th Century', and is a list of the principle families of Irish, Anglo-Norman and Anglo-Irish origin.

The second list compiled by Dr R R Madden, is of 'The Most Important Families In Ireland At the Beginning Of The 17th Century'. Both of these lists give the county of origin of the names listed.

The final list in this group, in verse, titled 'Modern Irish Gentry', is a list of names that came into Ireland with the Cromwellian Settlement or with the Revolution.

A large work on 'Anglo-Irish And Other Genealogies' follows the above lists and is in turn followed by another group of articles containing lists of names that could be of interest.

The first article on 'The Huguenots' contains a number of lists on this major ethnic group. The first list gives the anglicised versions of various French and Flemish names. The second list is of 'Names Of Foreign Refugees' who settled in Great Britain and Ireland before the reign of Louis XIV of France. The second list is of 'Names Of Foreign Refugees' who settled in Great Britain and Ireland during the reign of Louis XIV. The third list contains the names of Huguenot families Naturalized in Great Britain and Ireland between 1681 and 1712.

The second article on 'The Palatines' contains a list of families who settled in Ireland, and highlights those on the Adare estate.

The third article in this set was on 'The Ulster Plantation' and has lists of English Undertakers, Scotch Undertakers and Servitors and Irish Natives.

One of my ancestors bore the name Snell and came from Ireland to Australia. The name Snell is not very common in Ireland but lists in this book show a Snell going to Ireland with Cro mwe 11 and the name also appears in the list of Huguenots going to Great Britain and Ireland during the reign of Louis XIV. I have located Snell in Griffiths in the correct part of Ireland.

Next month I will have a look at some of the other item in this volume.

On 19 May the schooner 'Sarah Mary' (145 tons burthen) arrived from Auckland with skipper, Capt Henry PRIEST, and crew of six, bringing 18,322 feet of white timber sawn and dressed and up to 102,000 feet of timber sawn roughly. The 'Sarah Mary' cleared out of Auckland Harbour on 14 April.

Three known makers of spinning wheels in the district were :- John MURRAY of Warrnambool, John M'CRAE of Purnim and Hugh FINLAYSON of Hexham.

A curious flax wheel from Westmeath, Ireland, donated to the Warrnambool museum by the late Thomas DARGAN, was described in detail.
